PROGRAMS & SERVICES FOR ARTISTS

The Council supports artists in several important ways, through a wide array of programs and services that recognizes, encourages and showcases their talents. In turn, such recognition brings their work to the attention of organizations and communities everywhere to embrace and support this remarkable "creative capital" that helps make New Jersey great.

Individual Artist Fellowship Awards: Highly competitive awards to New Jersey artists in 12 different artistic disciplines awarded solely on artistic excellence taken from work samples of recently completed work by independent peer panel assessment. The process is anonymous and not based on need or project proposals. The awards may be used to support the professional development of the artist. This program is carried out in partnership with the Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation.

The application deadline for the following disciplines is July 15, 2016: Choreography, Music Composition, Poetry and Sculpture. Awards for these disciplines will be announced in February 2017.

The application deadline for the following disciplines is July 14, 2017: Crafts, Playwriting, Photography and Interdisciplinary Performance Awards for these disciplines will be announced in February 2018.

The application deadline for the following disciplines is July 16, 2018: Media/Digital/Electronic, Painting, Prose and Works on Paper. Awards for these disciplines will be announced in February 2019.

Fellowship Showcases: Each year the Council cosponsors an exhibition or showcase for Fellowship award winners in either visual arts, choreography or literary arts. In 2016-17 a showcase of literary artists will be co-sponsored with the Writers Theatre of New Jersey.

The Arts Inclusion Program: Since the passage of the Public Building Arts Inclusion Act in 1978, this program has led to the commissioning and installation of hundreds of artworks in state financed construction projects of State Buildings. Up to 1.5% of the construction budget is set aside for this purpose. The Council assists State agencies and State Universities in the selection of artists for all projects including those for NJ Transit's Transit Arts Program and such major projects as the WW II Memorial and the NJ September 11 Memorial design competition. To register for this program visit www.callforentry.org. Announcements of New Jersey Arts Inclusion Projects will be listed under the "Public Art" category when available. This free service allows the project selection committee to view and vote on work samples submitted by those responding to the call.

NJ Arts Annuals: Each year a visual arts exhibition is mounted, either in fine arts or crafts, at one of the State's major museums or galleries. In 2017 The State Museum will present a 50th Anniversary retrospective celebrating the State Arts Council and the artists of New Jersey.

Artist Roundtable: Open to artists in all disciplines the program provides an overview of the Council's programs & services with career development topics. The format and topics of the Roundtable change yearly and are based on current trends and participant feedback.

Artists' Career Development Seminars: Each year the Council cosponsors two regional seminars on topics of relevance for the professional development of New Jersey artists. In 2017 the Council will partner with Creative Capital and the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation in a five-month blended learning program. Host site locations include Newark, Trenton and Hammonton, NJ.

Folk Arts Apprenticeships: Grants to individuals to encourage cultural communities to continue passing on their valued art forms in traditional settings by providing stipends to master folk artists and crafts persons that can help apprentices develop greater skills. Since 1995 these modest grants have supported apprenticeships in dozens of different cultural communities and scores of different art forms, reflecting the rich array of traditional arts in our state. Applications are available in the winter with a deadline for submission in the spring and awards announced in July.

Artist in Education Residency: Through the Artists-in-Education Residency grant program practicing professional artists are placed in long-term residencies (20-100 days) in schools across the state. Residencies are offered in all disciplines and at all grade levels. All schools can apply for one-year residencies. Any artist can apply to be accepted into the program.
